RAFFLES' BANDED LANGURS IN SINGAPORE

The Raffles' banded langur (*Presbytis femoralis femoralis*) is critically endangered in Singapore with a small population size and a restricted distribution. In order for conservation actions to be implemented, population estimate and distribution of the Raffles' banded langurs need to be updated through field surveys.
